

READING AT HOME



Time and time again, research shows that learning to read - and to love to read - is directly linked to children's success at school and

beyond.

With the new term getting under way we thought it would be a good opportunity to address how we would like to use the reading journals that are sent home alongside your child's reading book. The expectation is for all pupils in KS1 to read at home 5 times a week and in KS2 at least 3 times a week. A parent/adult should sign the journal after each read.

Inspire your young reader to practice every day

In KS1 give your child lots of opportunities to read aloud to you. Use the journal as a means of communication between home and school. The journals are checked daily as we guide our pupils with choosing the next text that they want to read. Your comments on how your children are approaching their reading at home are always appreciated and it helps us to build up a clear picture of how they are progressing. A sticker will be awarded to those children who have read 5 times in a week. A warning will be given if a pupil has not read at least 3 times in one week.

Read about it, talk about it, and think about it! Encourage your child to build understanding, the ultimate goal of learning how to read.

In KS2 the reading journals provide space for reflection and evaluation by the child. At the front of the journal their teacher will include a collection of activities that they may choose from. Entries can take a variety of forms such as: jottings, notes, diagrams and pictures, mind maps, questions, poems and so on. Once a week their teacher will check the journals and house points will be awarded to those who have read 3 times in that week. Any additional reading activity completed will also be rewarded by a house point. Warnings will be given if a pupil has not read at least 3 times in one week.

Thank you for your continued support. Parents play a key role in helping to develop a love of reading and together we can foster positive engagements with literature.
