OWL CLASS



It is lovely to see how all the children are settling into Owl class. It is always tricky returning to school

after the summer break, especially if you are changing classes, have a new teacher and moving key stage. We have spent the first two weeks getting used to routines and expectations.

This term our topic is 'Twit Twoo! Who are you?'. The children will be learning all about Owls and why everyone is different. In English, we have looked at descriptive writing, using Plop, the baby owl, from the story 'The Owl who was afraid of the dark'. In Maths, we are focusing on number bonds to support our mental maths skills. On Wednesday, we celebrated Roald Dahl day, reading some of Billy and the Minpins (a new release of The Minpins). In the afternoon, we had a live link up with Puffin Books, learning more about Roald Dahl and where he lived together with a

live lesson from Quentin Blake on how to draw Hornswogger from the story.

Next week, we are starting to investigate Owls and their habitats. If the children would like to do some independent research for our class research board it would be very beneficial to their work over the next few weeks.

WOODPECKER CLASS




A new year, a new year 6 cohort and new additions to Woodpecker class. It always feels strange at the upper end of KS2 when

children step up to meet the demands of being the oldest children in the school, the leaders and role models. And yet, within just one week, it is clear that this group is eminently ready to set the standard for Purley Primary School.

This week, our Maths work has involved consolidating understanding of place value, of reading, writing and working with multi-digit numbers. Ask your child to read this number: 765,539,901. Next, can they tell you what 1,000,000 more than this number would be? Or 1,000 less? Or a trickier one would be 100 more.

English has involved comprehension work using our class novel — There's a boy in the girl's bathroom by Louis Sachar. We are also unravelling a mystery about buildings disappearing across Europe and learning how to write incident reports.

Our topic this term is: Extreme Earth. We have learnt about the structure of the Earth using old tennis balls to create a cut-through model of our planet. We have also been learning about different climates across the world. *Mrs Archer*
