**Fierly Foxes** came in third place winning 30 house points


**Airy Herons** came in fourth place winning 20 house points

## BADGER CLASS



Badger class have had fun exploring ideas for a pirate adventure through drama. Following on from this, they planned and then wrote their own pirate adventure stories. Y2 tried really hard to think about the sequence of events and include adjectives and conjunctions in their sentences. Y1 worked hard to rehearse their sentences prior to writing and use the sounds in words to help them write independently. In Geography, we have been looking at the points of the compass and following directions to locate treasure on a map. In Maths, Y2 have been looking at how number bonds to 10 can help us learn the tens number bonds to 100. Y1 have been playing with numicon to help find different pairs of numbers that make a given total. They are beginning to match these pairs of numbers to addition sentences.

Next week, we will be designing and making pirate ships from reclaimed materials. Can you please help your child to collect different containers in order for them to make their boats. *Mrs Lyn-Jones*

## OWL CLASS



This week in Owl class, we have continued our research on Owls, focusing on the Barn Owl. The children have used this information to complete a fact sheet about them for their Owl books. In Maths, we have been concentrating on multiplication and its relationship with division. The Cubes are practising their 4 times table whilst the Spheres are working on the 6.

Our sewing projects are beginning to take shape and the children are now starting to embroider names and details on to them.

Many Thanks to Ms James and Mrs Wilson for your help this week. I do hope you will be coming again next week!

In RE we are thinking about people in authority and if Jesus has authority and if so over whom.

Next week, we are finishing our Owl books designing covers and writing the blurb. We will also start to think about our part in the Harvest Festival. You child may have one or two lines that they need to learn; your help with this would be appreciated.

Finally may I remind you to sign your child's reading book when you see or witness them read for 20mins each day. If they manage it five times in a week they do get a house point. *Mrs Pickering*

## WOODPECKER CLASS



Continuing with our extreme earth topic, we have been learning about earthquakes this week. We have considered the physical geographical causes, the catastrophic consequences and the preventative measures which can be taken to reduce damage and injury during earthquakes.

In Maths, we have been converting metric measures and learning how to manage calculations which involve different metric units. Can you engage your child in the following problem: Chloe is 0.85m tall on her 9th Birthday. She grows 2cm every month for the next year. How tall is she on her 10th Birthday?

In English, we have been learning to write an effective newspaper report using a clear, balanced tone. We are also enjoying our class story, There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom. The novel addresses issues of loneliness, bullying and prejudice. Although the story is very funny, it facilitates discussions around these thorny areas and many questions have arisen as a result: if someone smiles or laughs, does it always mean they are happy? If someone says they don't care about something, does that mean they really don't care? Can you buy a friend? Can you have a friend you don't like?

In Science, we have considered how a species would need to adapt to survive a new environment. A fictional meteorite has affected our planet and altered the poles - the rainforest has now become extremely cold and animals are having to adapt to a new environment. Children have created polar toucans, arctic jaguars and a variety of other creatures originating in the rainforest but adapting to arctic conditions in order for the species to survive. *Mrs Archer*
