

Maths

We will be counting between 1-20, estimating groups of objects and checking by counting. We will explore repeating patterns involving sounds, actions and objects. We will begin to look at odds and evens and count in twos. We will continue to learn simple units of time such as days, months and seasons, and practise measuring length, height and weight.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will begin to consider ways to resolve conflicts with our peers by finding a compromise and negotiate to solve problems without aggression. We will continue to gain confidence in new social situations and in speaking to others about our needs, wants, interests and opinions.

Communication & Language

We will join in with repeated refrains and anticipate key events and phrases in rhymes and stories. We will continue to develop our ability to maintain concentration and sit quietly during appropriate activities. We will explore how and why questions and give explanations. We will use talk to connect ideas and retell past experiences and clarify thinking.

Physical Development

We will begin to develop our skills in catching, balancing on one foot, and will gain confidence in moving around, under, over and through equipment. We will begin to form recognisable letters and use simple tools to effect changes to materials. We will begin to show understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges.

Expressive Arts & Design

We will be singing familiar songs and joining in with dancing and ring games. We will construct with a purpose using a variety of resources, joining construction pieces together to build and balance. We will make up rhythms and create movement in response to music.
