Primary School's Sport Funding 2016/17

PE and sport premium for primary schools.

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The Government, together with The Department of Education, Health and Culture and Media Sport, have continued their initial three funding incentive for the academic year 2106/2017. They are committed to ensure that the money goes directly to the school's headteacher to fund development of PE and sport within the school. The amount received is dependent on the number of pupils on the school role.

Purley Primary School is strongly committed to PE and Sports activities. The emphasis has increased as we expand into KS2. In line with our school aims and values, PE and sport plays an important role in encouraging children to develop and adopt a positive approach to their own health and well-being, together with supporting a positive attitude to learning across the whole curriculum. Last year we ensured all teachers were trained in real PE and employed a sports coach from Get Active to support PE teaching within KS2. The lack of space within our school environment has meant providing a balanced PE curriculum rather challenging. This will be our main focus for these funds over the next year.

Summary and impact of Sports Funding spending 2016/2017

- Purchase of new equipment to support delivery of sport, particularly team sports for KS2
- Teaching staff are trained to deliver the REAL PE programme, developing skills that can be applied across the range of sporting activities.
- Provision to provide a range of extra-curricular activities for the children in an after-school setting. These have included: football, gymnastics, chess, cheerleading and dance.
- Tennis coaching for our upper KS2 children.
- PE lessons are taken either outside in school grounds if weather is fine or in the school hall if wet. We also have the use of a school field located at the local farm.
- We have now secured use of the local playing field to accommodate the KS2 activities that often require more space and to hold our annual sports days.
- The children have had the opportunity to compete in interschool competitions for football, cricket and swimming. We are now hoping to start competing in netball and cross country. The school hosted the Year 2 swimming gala.
- A yearly Sports day is held where children are encouraged to do their best, our ethos is strongly linked to taking part and support our team. This develops

children resilience to accepting both winning and losing.

- We have supported Cancer research, by holding our own Race for life.
- Our year 2 children attend swimming lessons. 1 hour each for week for the complete academic year.

At Purley School we are highly committed to ensuring that all children can swim unaided by the end of year 2. This is particularly important to us as the majority of our children live in close proximity to the River Thames and often use this area for leisure activities with their family and friends. Over the last 6 years, almost

			all our children, could keep them safe afloat in an emergency by the end of year 2
Transportation costs for Rushall farm	Funded from Main School Budget	To give children an opportunity to experience outdoor activities within the vicinity of a working farm and livestock.	Allows all children to have an outdoor experience. Encourages self-awareness and independence. Develops responsibility and team work.
Field rent	Funded from Main School Budget	Provides further outdoor space for children to access. The children use this regularly through spring and summer for PE lessons and also at lunchtimes for activities that require more space eg, football, cricket, running etc.	This secure area has allowed us to develop sport activity skills and also provided a venue for our KS1 sports days. The children thoroughly enjoy going to the field and having space to put their skills in practise by playing games of football, cricket, tag rugby etc.

Following the expansion of the school to accommodate KS2 children we have been investigating the cost and feasibility of providing a hard standing, netted ball court, for football and netball, within the school grounds. The development of this area will also allow for a larger variety of sport

based extra-curricular clubs to be held. We have now received quotes for the above and are currently submitting planning application for the development of a netted ball court.

To prolong the life of the equipment, we are also purchasing a new shed for storage of the sports equipment. We are also purchasing printed purple t-shirts for the children to wear when competing in school tournaments, to enhance team moral. As a school, it is a priority to try and continue to supplement travel costs to sport activities to ensure access for all.
