The amount received is dependent on the number of pupils on the school role. This ring fenced money provided by the departments of health and education should be used to

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that the school offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure the improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
